Twenty-five State ERA Tour Heads to New Jersey with Historic 1916 Saxon Motor Car Used in Suffrage Tour

During the 2026 Women's History Month, a major national advocacy campaign — the **Driving the Vote for Equality** Tour — heads to New Jersey with an eye-catching, historical visual — a restored **1914 Saxon motor car**, called the Golden Flyer II, the same make and model driven by two suffragists on their groundbreaking 10,700-mile cross-country campaign for women's voting rights.

In 1916, suffrage was stalled, just like the Equal Rights Amendment is stalled today. Following in the suffragists' footsteps, the [ERA NOW](#) tour will travel through 25 states to raise awareness and activate supporters as it mobilizes voters and collects petition signatures for the National ERA petition drive, [Sign4ERA.org](#).

Outside the City Hall Atrium (Monday) and Alice Paul Center for Gender Justice (Tuesday) will be a **strong photo and video assignment:** bright gold vintage car, period banners, advocates in suffrage sashes, and outdoor visuals.

Inside the City Hall Atrium, Mayor Gusciora will speak about the benefits of the ERA. The following day at the **Alice Paul Center for Gender Justice**, author of *Driving the Vote for Women* Jeryl Schriever gives a talk about the journey of Alice Burke and Nell Richardson, the two suffragists who made the historic cross-country push for women's voting rights. Joining them will be ERA New Jersey and national leaders who are finding inspiration and new energy as they organize the ERA Tour.

Monday

10:00 - 10:30 AM – Mayor Gusciora speaks in the City Hall Atrium. The 1914 Saxon motor car staged for photo op, b-roll opportunities and selfies. Interviews are available.

12:00 PM – The Golden Flyer II motors around the Trenton Capital area with its banner for equality taking selfies, collecting signatures for the national ERA petition and spreading the word about the status of the ERA.

Tuesday

9:00 AM – Jeryl Schriever speaks at the Alice Paul Center for Gender Justice about Alice and Nell's courageous 1916 journey for women's right to vote.

10:00 AM – Golden Flyer II available immediately afterwards for photo-ops and rides around town. Then off to Delaware, Maryland, DC, Virginia and on to 20 more states.

Interviews with spokespeople, including owners of the Saxon, can be arranged on-site for one hour until the Saxon leaves for Delaware.

COVERAGE DETAILS

First introduced in 1923 and passed by Congress in 1972, the ERA affirms that equality of rights under the law shall not be denied or abridged by the United States or by any state on account of sex.

Thirty-eight states have ratified the Equal Rights Amendment, fulfilling every constitutional requirement. ERA NOW and other supporters are pushing Congress for a Joint Resolution to recognize the ERA as the 28th Amendment, thus eliminating any uncertainties about an arbitrary time limit.

The Driving the Vote for Equality Tour aims to collect one million petition signatures by Election Day 2026 and build the Congressional majority needed to finish the work the suffragists began over a century ago.
